WILD CARE was founded in 1993 and was incorporated as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit in 1994. WILD CARE'S mission is to treat orphaned, injured or ill wildlife through professional Wildlife Rehabilitation; to reduce the numbers of animals impacted by human activity through Educational Outreach; and to help protect native Cape Cod species and the ecosystems they represent through Advocacy and Conservation. We are open 365 days per year, 7 days per week and operate a daily Wildlife Helpline from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. We are also the ONLY wildlife rehabilitation center on Cape Cod that provides wildlife rescue services.
