You can always tell that autumn has arrived, just by looking in our Clinic. The baby animal season has now come to an end. The colder temperatures bring with it the migratory songbirds, and seabirds that winter off our shores.

Reflecting on this year, I feel so proud of Wild Care and the dedication of our staff and the countless lives they have touched – both animals and humans. For 30 years, our Mission has remained the same.

“To help sick, injured and orphaned wildlife through Wildlife Rehabilitation, to reduce the number of animals impacted by human activity through Educational Outreach, and help protect the species and the ecosystems they represent, through Advocacy and Conservation.”

WILDLIFE REHABILITATION

This year, we've provided care to 1,700 sick, injured and orphaned animals. Of these animals, 919 (54%) were orphans in need of critical supportive care and shelter until capable of independent survival and release. Our dedicated and skilled staff of Wildlife Rehabilitators' work nearly round the clock to care for neonatal animals in need.

EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH

This year, we provided 40 in-person and virtual Outreach and Education Programs to schools, senior and community centers, religious organizations, town and government agencies, local nonprofits and wildlife conferences. Our program messaging focuses on co-existing with wildlife, local species awareness, and becoming stewards for wildlife and their habitats.

CONSERVATION AND ADVOCACY

Wild Care is a leading voice within the community regarding humane alternatives to rodenticides, prevention of songbird window strikes, and the negative impacts of fishing debris on wildlife. We are also the eyes and ears on the ground for government and local agencies in recognizing emerging diseases as well as impacts to wildlife and their habitats.

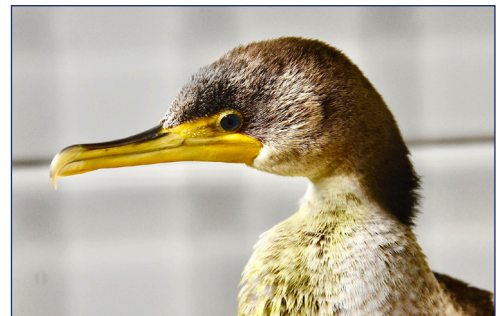
